**PURPOSE**

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) lists the transportation planning activities to be completed by the Centre County Metropolitan Planning Organization (CCMPO) between July 1, 2008 and June 30, 2009. Preparation of this document is a required element of federal metropolitan transportation planning regulations.

**INTRODUCTION**

Federal law and regulations require that in all urbanized areas with a population of over 50,000 persons, local and state officials work cooperatively to maintain a continuous and comprehensive long-range transportation planning program. This federal mandate is carried out by a formal group called a "metropolitan planning organization (MPO)".

The Centre Region MPO was formed in 1982, and succeeded the Centre Region Area Transportation Study (CRATS), which had previously been responsible for conducting long-range transportation planning in the State College, Pennsylvania area. By 2003, the Centre Region MPO coordinated transportation planning efforts in the geographic area which included Benner, College, Ferguson, Halfmoon, Harris, Patton, and Spring Townships, Bellefonte Borough, and State College Borough in Centre County, Pennsylvania. In November 2003, the Centre Region MPO Coordinating Committee expanded the MPO to a countywide organization, effective in January 2004. The boundary of the CCMPO now includes all of Centre County.

The CCMPO works closely with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) and the Centre Area Transportation Authority (CATA) to identify and prioritize transportation improvement projects in Centre County.

**COMMITTEE STRUCTURE**

The policy-making body of the CCMPO is the Coordinating Committee, which is ultimately responsible for the transportation planning activities mandated in federal laws and regulations. The Coordinating Committee includes nineteen voting members from county and local government, public agencies, and PennDOT.

A Technical Committee provides advisory comments and recommendations to the Coordinating Committee. The Technical Committee is comprised of members from the same organizations represented on the Coordinating Committee.

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**RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) and the federal Statewide and Metropolitan Transportation Planning Final Rule specify the primary roles and responsibilities of MPOs, which include development of a long-range transportation plan, development of the short-range Transportation Improvement Program, and public involvement efforts. SAFETEA-LU and the federal rule also specify MPO planning activities, and establish the required processes for these activities.

The adoption of a long-range (twenty-year) transportation plan is one of the primary responsibilities of the CCMPO. The CCMPO adopted the Centre County Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) in September 2006. An update to the LRTP was adopted in 2007 to ensure full compliance with SAFETEA-LU requirements. The LRTP is scheduled to be updated again in 2008 to incorporate additional projects and adjust project costs and schedules.

A second primary responsibility of the CCMPO is to approve the use of federal funds for highway and mass transit projects within Centre County. This responsibility is fulfilled through the development and adoption of the short-range Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP details the proposed expenditure of federal funds and some state capital funds for specific projects in a four-year period, within specified limits of financial constraint. The TIP is updated every two years. In order to be included on the short-range TIP, projects must also be included on the MPO's adopted long-range plan.

The list of projects on the TIP is identical to the First Four Year segment of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Twelve Year Program (TYP), which is developed at the same time as the TIP, and adopted by the State Transportation Commission. The CCMPO will continue to work closely with PennDOT and CATA to develop and adopt the TIP.

In addition to SAFETEA-LU, the Clean Air Act Amendments (CAAA) of 1990 specifies planning activities for MPOs, in particular for areas exhibiting air quality that is not in attainment with acceptable standards. Prior to 2004, air quality in Centre County was in attainment with the standards in the CAAA, and there were no special planning activities or processes required of the CCMPO. However, new air quality standards that became effective in June 2004 designated Centre County as a non-attainment area for ozone. Air quality conformity analyses were completed in 2006 and 2007 to ensure that the CCMPO's current TIP and LRTP conform to the new air quality standards. The latest air quality measurements have enabled Centre County to be redesignated as an attainment "maintenance" area, however, air quality conformity analyses must still be completed.

Federal regulations also require the MPO to develop and adopt a Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan to help guide the distribution of federal funds from certain transit programs that serve low income individuals, persons with disabilities, and the elderly. In 2007, the CCMPO adopted an Interim Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Plan, and the Plan will be updated in 2008 to ensure full compliance with federal regulations.

To facilitate citizen involvement in the planning process used to develop the LRTP, the TIP, and the Coordinated Plan, the CCMPO adopted a new Public Participation Plan in 2007. Certain proposed plans and programs must be made available for public review during a thirty (30) day comment period. The MPO is also required to hold a public meeting during this comment period.

The CCMPO is required to maintain and update a program of activities to address Environmental Justice and Title VI regulations, to prevent or mitigate adverse impacts to areas with concentrations of low income and minority populations. Concentrations of low income and minority households have been identified and mapped based on U.S. Census data, and this mapping is being updated using Census 2000 data and other information provided by local agencies and organizations. A program of activities to communicate with citizens in those areas about plans and programs must also be maintained. Existing techniques will be refined, and new techniques developed on an ongoing basis to improve communication between citizens, agencies and organizations, and the CCMPO.

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**STAFFING AND AGENCY SUPPORT**

Staff support for the CCMPO's transportation planning activities is provided by the Centre Regional Planning Agency (CRPA), CATA, Centre County Planning and Community Development Office (CCPCDO), PennDOT Engineering District 2-0 Office (Clearfield), and PennDOT Central Office (Harrisburg). These organizations work together to prepare transportation plans and programs, propose project priorities, and complete technical studies to be used by the CCMPO to make policy decisions and fulfill its responsibilities.

The major policy decisions required of the CCMPO, and the day-to-day work tasks completed by the CRPA, CATA, and CCPCDO are detailed in this Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). This document is prepared annually by staff, then reviewed by the CCMPO Technical Committee, and adopted by the CCMPO Coordinating Committee.

Funding to complete the work tasks in the UPWP comes from the Federal Highway Administration, Federal Transit Administration, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The federal and state funds must be matched by local funds, which are contributed by Centre County government, municipalities, and organizations represented on the CCMPO. The federal and state funds are made available through an annual legal agreement executed by PennDOT and the Centre Regional Planning Commission (CRPC), on behalf of the CCMPO.

Funding for the base portion of the FY 2008-09 UPWP totals (*to be determined*). In addition, supplemental planning funds in the total amount of (*to be determined*) will be used for (*to be determined*).

## I. PLANS AND PROGRAMS

### A. Administration

- Quarterly progress reports and invoices will be prepared and submitted within fifteen (15) days following the end of the quarter.
- The FY 2009-10 UPWP will be prepared and adopted by February 28, 2009. Submission of the UPWP by March 10, 2009 will include all documents required for execution of contracts between the Centre Regional Planning Commission (CRPC) and PennDOT, including Agreement Exhibits B and C, and resolutions authorizing CRPC's execution of Agreements. Candidate supplemental planning funds projects, including proposed Land Use Initiatives Program projects, must be included on the UPWP.
- Meeting notices and agendas will be prepared and will be available not less than five (5) working days prior to the meeting. Minutes of all MPO meetings will be prepared and circulated within fifteen (15) working days following the meetings. Completion as needed.
- Implement recommendations developed from the performance review of the CCMPO for its first years of operating as a countywide MPO. Consider adding representation from other modes and establishing an intermodal advisory committee.

**C. Programming**

- **Prepare and submit all supporting information for the adopted 2009-2012 Centre County Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to PennDOT by July 21, 2008, including information about the project selection and prioritization process used to develop the TIP.**
- **Assist PennDOT and CATA in the administration of the 2009-2012 TIP, including processing of TIP amendments through electronic means (eSTIP process). Work with PennDOT, FHWA, and FTA to update and improve the eSTIP process. Completion on an ongoing basis.**
- **Public involvement efforts will be consistent with the MPO's Public Participation Plan. Efforts will continue to expand and improve means of addressing Environmental Justice (EJ) requirements, to ensure that low income and minority population concentrations are informed about, and have opportunity to have input into the development of the TIP. Implement a Title VI/EJ Compliance Plan. Completion on an ongoing basis.**

**Information about the TIP will be provided by print and broadcast media, and other methods developed to circulate information directly to households in identified concentration areas (e.g. meetings, flyers, direct mailings, signs, surveys, etc.). Information will also be shared with agencies and organizations that provide services to low income and minority populations. The impact of prospective TIP projects on low income and minority population concentrations will be addressed.**

- **Identify strategies for advancing projects, or phases of projects, on the 2009-2012 TIP. Maintain and update an inventory of projects included in the Centre County Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). Completion on an ongoing basis.**
- **Continue to work with PennDOT and FHWA to incorporate safety into the planning and programming process. Refine procedures for prioritizing and selecting safety improvement projects for the Centre County LRTP and TIP, consistent with the state's Highway Safety Improvement Program and federal requirements. Schedule on-site safety reviews at high crash locations as needed. Completion on an ongoing basis.**
- **Refine process for selecting projects for Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funding. Completion as needed.**
- **Assist PennDOT and FHWA to implement the state's Work Zone Safety and Mobility policy, particularly related to projects that have a broad impact on safety and congestion.**
- **Assist in evaluation and deployment of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and advanced technology (e.g. signal operations, traffic data collection and organization). Completion as needed.**
- **Continue to work with PennDOT on the utilization of technology to share data included in the Multimodal Project Management System (MPMS). Completion as needed.**

**D. Long-Range Transportation Plan**

Preparation of the plan will include evaluation of projects, assessment of changes in travel patterns related to the development of growth areas specified in regional and municipal comprehensive plans, and an assessment of how new or improved roadways and public transportation systems may impact communities and affect the location, type, and intensity of land uses. (May be shared with supplemental planning funds Task VII).**
- **Participate in the implementation and update of the PennDOT District 2-0 Regional Operations Plan (ROP), ITS Architecture and ITS Strategic Plan to improve mobility and enhance incident management.**
- **Maintain and update travel demand model so that it may be used for the air quality conformity process and LRTP preparation. (May be shifted to supplemental planning funds Task VII).**
- **Work with PennDOT to implement actions included in the Commonwealth’s Mobility Plan (statewide long range transportation plan). Completion as needed.**
- **Work with PennDOT and FHWA to update the statewide inventory of intermodal facilities and National Highway System (NHS) intermodal connecting roadways, based on a review of federal criteria, thresholds and guidelines. Completion as needed.**
- **Assist PennDOT in promoting right-of-way preservation activities with municipalities and other agencies. Completion as needed.**

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**ACTIONS AND PROCEDURES**

- **Public involvement efforts will be consistent with the MPO's Public Participation Plan, as required by SAFETEA-LU. Special focus will be given to Environmental Justice requirements, to ensure that low income and minority population concentrations are informed about the development of the plan, and have ample opportunity to provide input.**

**In addition to use of print and broadcast media, other methods to circulate information directly to households in identified concentration areas will be developed and utilized (e.g. meetings, flyers, direct mailings, signs, surveys, etc.). Information will also be shared with agencies and organizations that provide services to low income and minority populations. The impact of projects included in the LRTP on low income and minority population concentrations will be addressed during preparation of, and updates to, the LRTP. Completion as needed.**

Completion on an ongoing basis.**
- **Coordinate public transportation planning activities with Penn State's Transportation Services Office, Centre County Office of Transportation (CCOT), and other transportation providers. Completion as needed.**
- **Complete data analysis and operations planning activities to assist CATA and the CCOT in planning service that optimizes the use of federal, state, and local funding. Completion as needed.**
- **Implement recommendations from the CATA/Centre County Assessment of Transportation Services, being completed using supplemental planning funds in the FY 2007-08 UPWP.**

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- **Low income and minority population concentrations will be identified, and provided opportunities to provide input about the development of new or revised public transportation services. Efforts to focus on provision of services to low income and minority population concentrations will be closely coordinated with agencies and organizations. Completion as needed.**

The specific number and type of counts (volume, machine classification, manual classification) will be determined by PennDOT. Assigned counts will not be taken on weekends or holidays, and will be submitted monthly, i.e. the last workday in the month in which the counts were taken. The counts may be outsourced to a third party service provider, particularly through the Commonwealth's statewide contract for Traffic Count Services (DGS #9985-27). All traffic counts will be collected by November 21, 2008 and all data submitted by December 31, 2008. Attend annual Traffic Counting Workshop.**
- **Purchase traffic counters and traffic counting supplies (road tube, tape, nails, etc.) as needed to complete traffic counts. These supplies are available on the Commonwealth's Statewide Contract for Traffic Counters (DGS #9905-17).**
- **Purchase safety equipment for traffic counting requirements, as needed to provide an adequate level of safety for field personnel.**
- **All updated traffic counts will be used to support transportation planning and programming activities, and aid in the maintenance and enhancement of the existing transportation infrastructure in Centre County.**

**VII. SUPPLEMENTAL PLANNING PROGRAM / LAND USE INITIATIVE PROGRAM**

**A. Update Travel Demand Model and Socioeconomic Forecast Data**

A new travel demand model was prepared for Centre County and portions of Clearfield County as part of the development of the South Central Centre County Transportation Study (SCCCTS) [canceled in March 2004] and the new Centre County Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) [adopted in 2006]. The travel demand model utilizes the TP-Plus modeling software, which is a new version of the MINUTP software utilized in the MPO's previous travel demand model.

Following the cancellation of SCCCTS, the model was used for the evaluation and prioritization of projects for the new Centre County LRTP. The model may also be utilized in the future for transportation corridor or subarea analyses, and could be utilized for air quality conformity purposes if additional development work and upgrades are made to the model. Over time, data inputs must be updated to reflect changes in land use that have occurred since the base model was completed in 2003, and current traffic volumes.

This work task would result in the completion of a significant update of the model and its associated data inputs. The updated model would be used for future air quality conformity determinations, for project assessment and analyses, and for the evaluation of transportation projects for the next major update of the LRTP, which is scheduled to begin in 2008 and conclude in 2010.

The work will be completed with a combination of MPO staff and outside consulting services, and would include but not be limited to:

- **Complete significant revisions to the socioeconomic input data for traffic analysis zones (TAZs), primarily focused on new forecasts of future land use conditions. The land use forecasting effort will include the preparation of a completely new parcel-based data set in database software that replaces the existing Excel spreadsheet system utilized in the 2003 forecasts. The new database is intended to be more user-friendly to facilitate future updates to the forecasts.**

**The new forecast effort will include coordination activities with county and regional planning organizations, municipal planning commissions and governing bodies. The forecasts will reflect the most up-to-date land use plans in the Centre County Comprehensive Plan, the three multi-municipal comprehensive plans adopted in Centre County (which address 18 of the 35 municipalities in the County), and other land use changes approved or proposed in area or corridor plans currently being prepared. In addition, the land use forecasts can also be used for other infrastructure planning efforts.**

- **Update key elements of the network and traffic analysis zone (TAZ) structure for the Centre County travel demand model, including network characteristics, trip generation equations, and mode split module.**
- **Update software and input data needed for air quality conformity purposes. The goal of this subtask is to utilize the model for air quality conformity purposes for the next major update of the LRTP, which is scheduled to be completed in 2010, and for the adoption of the 2013-2017 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), which will occur in 2012.**
- **Recalibrate model to current year (2008 or 2009) traffic conditions.**

- **Complete new runs of the model that can be used for the evaluation of projects for the LRTP, development of specific projects, and/or assessment of projects for land use and comprehensive planning purposes. Examples of potential uses include a system-wide analysis of travel trends (vehicle miles traveled, vehicle hours of travel, etc.), an assessment of how much traffic may be diverted from other routes by the proposed widening of State Route 3007 (Park Avenue), an update of estimated travel pattern changes related to the opening of Interstate 99 in Centre County, changes in patterns that may occur if the Route 322 Corridor O1 and South Central Centre County Transportation Studies are revisited in the future, changes in travel patterns related to the development of growth areas specified in regional and municipal comprehensive plans, and an assessment of how new or improved roadways and public transportation systems may impact communities and affect the location, type, and intensity of land uses.**
- **Procure and install updated software on the CCMPO’s computer system, and provide training for MPO staff.**
- **Purchase a new laptop computer capable of operating the model and GIS software, to facilitate the operation and display of land use model**

Because of the length time needed to coordinate and prepare new land use forecasts, work on this task would begin in FY 2008-09 and continue through FY 2009-010, utilizing a 24-month schedule of activities.

**B. Municipal Bridge Database**

The passage of Pennsylvania Act 44 of 2007 in July 2007 has significantly increased the level of state funding for highway and bridge projects. One of the focuses of the new funding is the rehabilitation or replacement of structurally deficient (SD) state bridges.

In 2007, PennDOT completed a detailed assessment of bridge conditions for the Commonwealth’s state-owned bridges, which resulted in the identification of the state’s highest priority bridge improvement projects. PennDOT’s recent effort dramatically increased the awareness of bridge improvement needs on the state-owned transportation system. However, there are many SD bridges in the Commonwealth that are owned by counties or municipalities. In Centre County, a need exists to prepare a complete inventory of all municipal bridges (there are no county-owned bridges in Centre County). The inventory would be an important element of the CCMPO’s process for prioritizing state and municipal bridge projects for the LRTP and TIP.

Along with the inventory, informational materials and outreach efforts focusing on the process for programming a municipal bridge project are needed to help municipal officials recognize and understand the options available for financing bridge improvements.

This project includes the completion of several work tasks that would assist in the programming of municipal bridge projects on the LRTP and TIP. Work would be performed with a combination of MPO staff and outside consulting services, and would include but not be limited to:

- **Prepare a comprehensive database of all municipal bridges in Centre County, including information from bridge inspection reports, photos, location maps, weight restrictions, usage (commercial, agriculture, school, EMS), detour routes and lengths, estimates of rehabilitation/replacement costs, and comments from municipal officials and citizens. The database would be utilized in the CCMPO’s project ranking process for the LRTP, and to assist in determining priorities for the TIP.**

The database would be developed in a user-friendly format to facilitate updates, which are anticipated to occur on an ongoing basis to reflect the latest bridge inspections and the respective bridge inspection reports.

- **Coordinate closely with PennDOT to ensure that the database and prioritization process is similar to the data and process used by PennDOT to assess and prioritize state bridge projects, so that state and municipal bridges are evaluated using the same data and methods.**
- **Prepare a description of the process used to include a municipal bridge project on the LRTP and TIP, including general timelines, contact persons, etc.**
- **Develop a summary of the financing options available to municipal officials for bridge projects.**
- **Develop outreach materials and an ongoing outreach process to keep local officials informed and involved in the process of including municipal bridge projects on the LRTP and TIP, as well as the process for advancing a project once funding has been programmed on the TIP. Complete initial outreach meetings as part of this work task as a pilot test of the outreach process and materials.**
- **Complete a prioritization process for municipal bridge projects as part of the major update of the LRTP, scheduled to begin in 2008 and be completed in 2010.**
